

October 2010 Minutes

Septembers' meeting was called to order at 7:37 p.m. and adjourned at 8:28 p.m. Clark, our treasurer, reported a current balance of \$2026.17.

Old business was our car show that was held September 19th. Discussion took place regarding the date of the show because it falls on the same date as West Point's show. The general consensus was that members would like to continue with the current date as most that attend West Point are not Mustang people. Club members also discussed having a food vendor on hand at next years show. Jeff Bridges volunteered his grill to use free of charge if needed.

Also, discussed as old business was the P-51 Gunfighter Mustang airplane photo shoot that took place October 2nd. Mike Boettcher brought cd's that were available to club members at a \$1 each. The club agreed that the group photo of our members and the plane will be sent to Larry Lumpkin (owner of the airplane) with a thank you note. Mike Boettcher volunteered to handle it.

Amber read an e-mail that was sent to the club from the Leap for a Cure organization. They are looking for someone that may be able to help them or offer some suggestions on how to put on a car show. If anyone would be interested in donating their time or helping out please contact Amber and she will forward you the information.

A motion was made to keep the current club officers the same for 2011.

The Veteran's Day Parade will be held November 6th. A vote was taken for a show of hands of who was interested in attending. About half a dozen members raised their hands. Dean Corpman volunteered to organize the event if there was enough club interest. He suggested that he would like to have 10 cars in order to proceed with the event. An e-mail was sent out following the meeting to see if there were enough people willing to drive their cars. The response received exceeded 10 cars so the club will participate.

Jeff and Barb Zorn volunteered to organize the x-mas party for the club. They will look into scheduling a party room at an available restaurant. The club took a vote on different dates in December and the general consensus was that people would like to have the party on December 11th. The club will have a gift exchange again with \$10 being the max spent. Several club members also expressed interest in collecting gifts for a charity. Chris Wurtele volunteered to organize this.

Mark Hughes brought in samples of a club window sticker that he had produced at a printing company. The sticker incorporated the Ford Mustang logo in the design.
